

Guidelines for Writing Test Questions

The provision of CE credit requires a mechanism that allows participants to assess their mastery of presented material. Therefore, each presentation requires a set of multiple-choice test questions. In general, the educational objectives and test questions should be representative of the full range of program content. Test questions should be multiple-choice, typically with four response options (A, B, C, D) for each question. A minimum of 5 test questions per presentation is recommended.

Content

- 1. Focus on a single issue, fact, or problem.
- 2. Test important material. Avoid trivial facts.
- 3. Use language appropriate for the audience. Use terminology common to dental practice.
- 4. Keep content of items independent from one another. Avoid interdependency that clues the test-taker to other items' answers.
- 5. Use good grammar, punctuation, spelling.

Stem: This is the introductory question or partial statement that the test-taker must answer or complete.

- 1. State the central idea clearly and concisely. Most of the text of the item should be in the stem and not in the response options.
- 2. Avoid overly specific knowledge, excess information, teaching in the stem.
- 3. Use positive statements in the stem. Avoid negative phrasing ("all of the following except," "which of the following is not") as much as possible.
- 4. Avoid the personal pronoun "you."

Response Options

- 1. Avoid "all of the above" and "none of the above."
- 2. Avoid simple "true-false" questions.
- 3. Avoid absolute terms such as "always," "never," "completely," and "absolutely."
- 4. Organize the responses in a logical or numerical order.
- 5. Make sure response options are independent and not overlapping.
- 6. State responses positively. Avoid negative words like "not" as much as possible.
- 7. Try to make all response options fairly consistent in length.
- 8. Make sure responses are homogenous in content and parallel in grammar.



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- 9. Make sure all responses are plausible. Avoid absurd or ridiculous options.
- 10. Make sure only one of the options is the correct answer. Clearly indicate which is the correct response.
